




Publication of CA4RJ Training Manual focusing on the use of restorative art in migrants' integration

The Manual was produced collectively by all partners, each of whom conducted user-led fieldwork with staff and creative professionals working with migrants, along with secondary research to explore how restorative justice and art can promote community cohesion.



The manual includes best practices across Europe regarding the use of restorative arts by practitioenrs working with migrants, as well as an identification of training needs in migrant integration.

Success story from the pilot

"My life before was regular, I wanted to improve it and have a future", says Fátima. However, taking the decision to open the bakery was not easy: "Before opening, I was working in a factory but after covid, after going to my country and coming back, I had it in my head".





Finally, she decided to take the risk and open a bakery.

"At first my family was scared because I didn't have much money, it was very difficult," she says. But with effort and perseverance, and thanks to personal recommendations, she has managed to get her business started. "Bread sells itself, if you do it well and with heart" she says. Her bakery is called Touba, which in dialect is the adjective used to describe a person "who has been brought up to be a good person, honest and hard-working.
